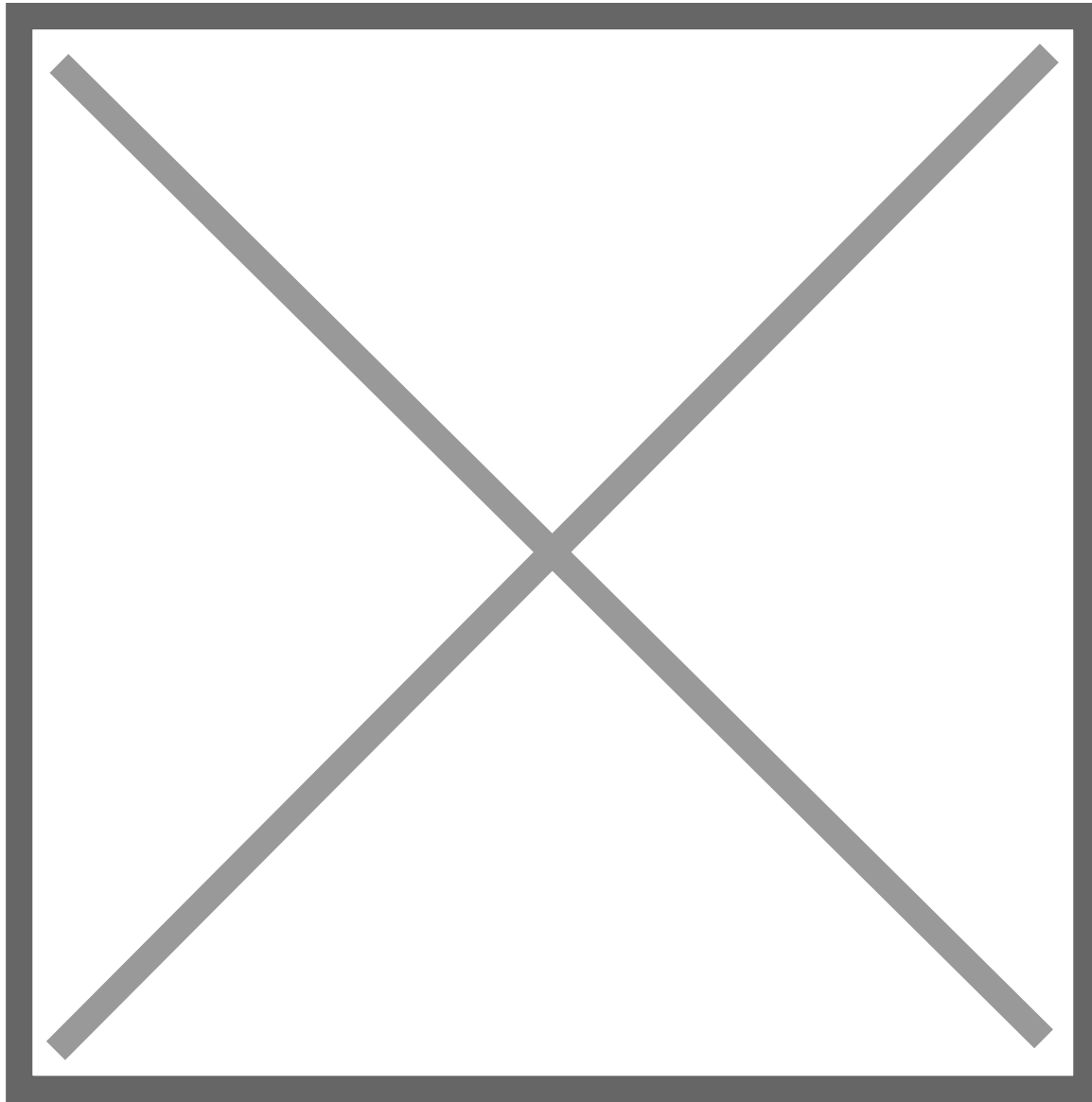


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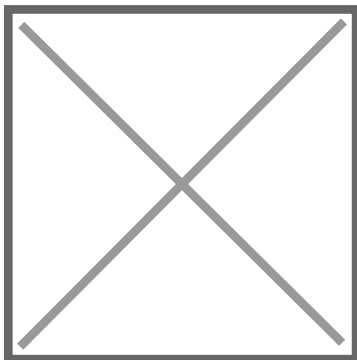

Hagley, Worcestershire, from John Preston Neale's Views of the Seats of Noblemen and Gentlemen in England and Wales, Scotland and Ireland. Hagley Hall is a Palladian-style mansion built in 1760 by Sanderson Miller for George Lyttelton, 1st Baron Lyttelton (1709-73). 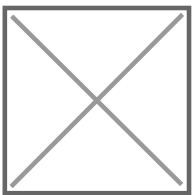

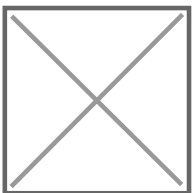
