The other side shows a soldier's return: the girl holds out her apron to receive money and a watch, presumably

booty. Robinson could have used a sailor's return, but chose to diversify his potential markets for the jug at the risk of weakening its appeal. Probably a bad decision.

Creamware jug printed in black by John Robinson in Burslem, Staffordshire, with "Box the Compass", including his signature in the centre of the compass. Printed after his move from Liverpool to Burslem, where he is recorded between 1784 and 1805. Boxing the compass meant listing all the compass points in order, from north to north by east, north-northeast, northeast by north, northeast, northeast by east,
