Ghaut of Cutwa, on the Ganges, opposite page 130 of Charles Ramus Forrest's *A Picturesque Tour along the Rivers Ganges and Jumna in India*, published in 1824 by Rudolf Ackermann, London. Ghaut is another word for ghat, a landing place by a body of water, in this case a series

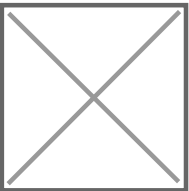
