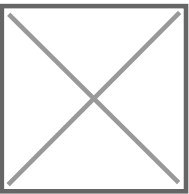

Description:

A rare molded earthenware Toby mug printed in blue with a floral chintz-type pattern on the jacket and on the brim of the tri-corner hat. The other surfaces on the remainder of the body were hand painted overglaze. The original lid is missing from this example. The figure holds a jug of ale. Sampson Smith, Longton, produced a large number of Toby-shaped mugs, modeled after *expand [+]*
